The Fiscal Year in Review

With the HOA fiscal year ended on June 30th, it is a good time to review accomplishments of the past 12 months. What did the HOA do for you and for the good of our community, and were your annual dues used wisely?

Here's a quick accounting:

Communication Efforts -

were increased via a new website, entrance signage, informational emails as needed, and printed pieces delivered to non-email residents & non-HOA members: all efforts to help everyone know more about the neighborhood.

HOA Membership - renewed personal contacts & periodic letters led to a record high participation of 76%, up from the previous year of 70%. The Welcome Committee implemented a better process including new and revised materials for calling efforts and the welcome kit.

Improved Appearance - the entrance island was cleared and revitalized with new landscaping and flowering perennials, for a lovely new first impression! A new lawn & landscape contractor was selected after a competitive bidding process: this should improve the appearance of the common areas while saving HOA funds. Volunteers removed graffiti, picked up trash, and addressed street light and sign issues.

Special Projects – the 5 yr. Dogwood Creek Park project kicked off, and when completed, will enhance the desirability of our neighborhood. Plus it will provide a safe place for kids to play, and create a natural space for all to rejuvenate the body, mind and spirit!

Fundraising Efforts – not content to rely on annual dues to get things done, nine (9) special events were held, raising total of \$2,568:

Of the donations and funds raised, \$646 from the first two efforts were used for new landscaping and general purpose needs. Subsequent efforts yielded \$1,922 for Park funding and development. *Coming up: Labor Day Smoked Meat Sale.*

By exercising excellent expense control last year, we are pleased to announce a budget surplus of \$1,344 for the fiscal year end (FYE) on June 30th. This was also due to fundraising activities and residents paying their HOA dues at an all-time high. The surplus will be saved in a "rainy day" account; special projects such as the new Park will continue to have separate fundraising activities.

What's the rule on burning debris, especially in summertime drought conditions? As it turns out, droughts have nothing to do with a burn ban - according to Chelsea Fire Chief Shirley, the state of Alabama only allows burning from November 1st thru April 1st because of EPA rules on air pollution. And during the approved months, a fire must be at least 500 feet away from any residence.
